Responsible Sourcing Principles - Cotton and Related Products

Our commitment

Fortescue is committed to understanding, mitigating, and addressing sustainability risks in its supply chain.

Fortescue will prioritise suppliers and their partners who can demonstrate a commitment to our Responsible Sourcing Principles (the 'Principles').

The Principles are used to assess if a supplier can meet, or is working towards continuous improvement of their sustainable procurement approach.

The Principles

Suppliers are expected to demonstrate:

- 1. A genuine commitment to sustainable procurement with established due diligence processes to identify and understand sustainability risks in their supply chain.
- 2. Culture of collaboration and commitment to continuous improvement for purposefully driving sustainability outcomes across multiple layers of their supply chain.
- 3. Commitment to sustainable sourcing of materials to address various risks associated with cotton production and garment manufacturing, including:
 - Sourcing of organic and sustainably grown materials.
 - Integration of reclaimed or recycled materials.
 - Social Responsibility, human rights and worker/labour rights.
- 4. Understanding of supply chain inputs and actors with processes to improve supply chain transparency beyond Tier 1 (their direct suppliers).
- 5. Establishment of ethical recruitment, living wage and adoption of the employer pays principle.
- 6. They do not source, or can evidence responsible sourcing, from areas recognised as high risk for human rights and modern slavery concerns.
